

Learning German – Information for International Students

In most study programs at German higher education institutions, the language of instruction is German. Therefore, sufficient language skills are usually a prerequisite for studying in Germany. Even if you apply for a study program that is taught in English, it will be helpful to learn German – at least for daily life situations. Also, German language skills can have a positive effect on how comfortable you feel in Germany since it will be easier for you to find your way around and make new friends.

Language requirements at HSHL¹

HSHL requires a high level of German language proficiency from all students who apply for a study program taught in German. Currently, only two study programs at HSHL are taught entirely in English and therefore do not require German language knowledge:

- B.Eng. Electronic Engineering
- M.Sc. Intercultural Business Psychology

In order to enrol in any study program at HSHL that is taught in German, you need to have obtained one of the following <u>German language certificates</u>:

- ✓ <u>DSH 2 or DSH 3</u> (Deutsche Sprachprüfung für den Hochschulzugang)
- ✓ <u>TestDaF</u> with at least 4 points in all sections (Test Deutsch als Fremdsprache)
- ✓ <u>Telc Deutsch C1 Hochschule</u>
- ✓ Deutsches Sprachdiplom Level 2 of KMK
- ✓ Feststellungsprüfung of a Studienkolleg
- ✓ Goethe Institute GDS (Großes Deutsches Sprachdiplom)
- *Please note*: HSHL does not offer any German preparation courses.

What else can I do to practice and improve my German language knowledge?

- Participate in cultural events organized by the <u>AStA</u> and the International Office and use the <u>sports programs</u> offered at HSHL to get in touch with other German students.

- Listen to German music, podcasts and watch TV or movies in German with subtitles.
- You can choose to live in a shared apartment with other German students.
- Participate in other cultural events or join clubs outside the university.
- Try to find a language tandem partner. Tandem means that two native speakers of different languages help each other to learn their respective languages.
- Post your tandem search ad on the notice board in Hamm (building H1.1-E00 and in the canteen) or Lippstadt (building L2.1-E00), on social media channels and on mediation services like <u>www.vhs-tandem.de/en/</u>.
